Learning Corner

Otters

This week in phonics we reviewed the “ow” sound and all the different ways it can be spelled. We also continued our animal books by writing questions and researching our answers. In maths, we have been solving challenging halving and doubling problems. In science we sorted animal pictures independently into their groups, eg mammals, fish and discussed any surprises.

Foxes

This week in Foxes we have finished writing our dragon adventure stories. Ask your child what happens in their story. We have also wrote recounts about our trip to Haynes motor museum.

In maths, we have been recapping properties of shapes and have used Carroll diagrams to sort 2D shapes. We have also been looking at right angles and degrees for turns. Some of the children were even able to give direction using this information.

In art we have been collaging dragons.
