Learning Corner

Badgers: In music, Badgers have been learning about sea chanties and why they were sung. They have learnt and made up an accompaniment to 'Drunken Sailor' and have additionally made up their own verses to go with the music.

In maths, Y5 and Y6 have revised, amongst other things: angle and measure including the accurate use of a protractor and ruler to draw and measure angles and relevant terms, for example, parallel and perpendicular, opposite and adjacent.

This week in worship, we have begun to share the story of Joseph. Will he forgive his brothers for what they did to him?

Foxes: This week in Foxes, we have started to learn about Captain Scott of the Antarctic. The children have been thinking about what it would have been like to camp there and have set up Scott's camp in our classroom.

In maths, year 3 have been learning how to find the perimeter of 2D shapes. Whilst year 2 have been revising properties of 3D shapes and how to find lines of symmetry in 2D shapes.

In English this week, Foxes class have been rewriting the Owl and the Pussy Cat poem. They have changed the characters and other parts of the poem. It has been very tricky because they have had to make sure their poem still has the right rhythm. They have had to clap the syllables in each line to check.

Otters: In phonics this week, we have been investigating different ways of spelling the /oo/ phoneme. In English we read and discussed the story of "The Paper Bag Princess". Later in the week we began to write comparative words by adding the suffix *er* or *est* to an adjective eg tall, taller, tallest.

In maths, we used our knowledge of number bonds to 10 to help us write addition and subtraction calculations.

In history, we learned about wooden and stone castles. We built a castle using our new large construction set.
